Back in Action - Pain Free

ive years ago, Susan
Robinson woke to
severe pain in her right
buttock. She said it was
a complete mystery as
to what caused it. "It felt
like an ice pick was stuck
there," she recalls.

With every step she took, pain radiated from her backside down to her knees. "She was standing and walking with bent-over posture because of the pain," says Susan's husband, Timothy.

Unsure of what was causing the pain, Susan began various treatments including physical therapy sessions and selective steroid injections, but with no relief.

Susan was an athlete who loved to ski and play tennis - and a schoolteacher. With the pain, she says, "It was a miserable existence."

When she finally consulted with two neurosurgeons in Boston, where she and her husband were living at the time, they told her she needed spinal fusion surgery.

"I was hesitant because they never truly explained anything to me," says Susan. "I had tried and failed at previous attempts to manage my pain, and didn't want to go down that path again."

However, when Susan's mother passed away this past January, she and her husband came to Falls Church, Va., to be with her father. And that's when she sought care from MedStar Montgomery Medical Center.

Susan's first appointment at the Department of Neurosurgery at MedStar Montgomery was with neurosurgeon Alexandros Powers, MD, who specializes in back pain and care, and his physician assistant, Celeste Aquino, PA.

Susan was immediately taken with Dr. Powers's ability to explain everything to her. "He said, this is what we're

going to do and why. I honestly thought I would go to see him and hear the same thing I had heard before, but I didn't," she says.

Aquino says she is familiar with this type of response from patients. "Dr. Powers is a very communicative surgeon, and you don't always find that. He does an excellent job of making patients feel comfortable and helps them really understand their treatment plans."

Dr. Powers soon found that Susan's L4 and L5 vertebrae in her lower

back moved a quarter inch when she stood up - a fairly common condition called spondylolisthesis. In Susan's case, it was likely caused by a series of falls she experienced while skiing, but it can also occur from general aging of the body.

"Every time Susan had stood up or walked, her lower vertebrae shifted a little bit," says Dr. Powers. "With spinal fusion surgery, the vertebrae are joined together as one unit to stop that from happening, ultimately alleviating pain."

Susan was eager to begin her treatment after Dr. Powers explained to her that she would be able to return to the activities she once loved. "Dr. Powers told me why the spinal fusion was the best solution. I had not one bit of fear," she recalls.

The first time Susan stood up after her surgery, she felt not an ounce of pain. It was such an emotional moment that she and her nurses began to cry.

"Susan was such an active person before her pain took over and to see her stand up straight and walk comfortably after almost five years - it was a miracle," says Aquino.

To Susan, Dr. Powers is the master of fusion. "I'm healed. It's beyond anything I could imagine. For me, Dr. Powers walks on water. I am so grateful."

Stopping StrokesIn Their Tracks

he late October workday morning started out like most others for Kim Blackwell and her husband, Greg.

Until Kim's world suddenly went sideways.

"I remember trying to make Greg's sandwich for his lunch and saying to him that something wasn't right," says Kim, age 54.

When Greg looked up from across the room, he could see that she was struggling to stand up straight.

"One corner of her mouth was drooping as she was talking and I couldn't understand what she was saying," Greg recalls. "I told her I was taking her to the hospital." Fortunately, the Blackwells live two miles from MedStar Montgomery Medical Center.

Fast action by Greg and expert intervention by the MedStar Montgomery Emergency Department Stroke Team stopped Kim's stroke in its tracks.

That morning, Kim could have died or suffered severe and permanent disability. She had experienced an ischemic stroke—a type of stroke that occurs when blood supply to the brain is blocked.

"The team assembled right away. Everyone was calm and the doctor explained to us what was happening," recalls Greg.

In the Emergency Department, the Stroke Team worked quickly to assess Kim's symptoms. Brain scans were taken to rule out the possibility of a hemorrhagic stroke—a type of stroke that occurs when a blood vessel

breaks open or leaks. Treatment options depend on the type of stroke.

"The Blackwells could pinpoint exactly when Kim's symptoms started," says Tina Kirchner-Sullivan, ACNP, DNP, MedStar Montgomery Stroke Coordinator. "Timing is so critically important when a stroke is suspected. We have a strict protocol to follow when administering stroke medications. To achieve the best possible recovery, we have three hours, or up to four and a half hours for certain patients, from when symptoms first appear to the time we begin treatment."

Kim couldn't move the left side of her body or respond accurately. She also began having weakness in her right leg and difficulty moving her left eye from side to side.

When moments matter in stroke treatment, our stroke team of physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners and radiologists provide highly specialized care to patients.

"The symptoms we saw were signs that a large artery in Kim's brain was blocked. This is a posterior circulation stroke," explains Kirchner-Sullivan. Plans were made to transfer Kim by air to MedStar Washington Hospital Center for specialized stroke treatment.

Kim then received tissue plasminogen activator, commonly known as tPA. The medication is considered the standard of care for ischemic stroke, as long as the patient begins treatment within three hours after symptoms begin.

About an hour after Kim's treatment began at MedStar Mongtomery, "Kim moved her leg just a bit and looked at me. 'The medicine must be starting to work,' I remember thinking," recalls Greg.

At MedStar Washington Hospital Center, the stroke team repeated the brain scans and evaluated Kim's condition to determine crucial next steps.

The new images of Kim's brain were the best pictures ever for Kim and her family. While evidence of a small stroke was visible, there was no clot to remove. The medication administered at MedStar Montgomery had dissolved it.

Now, Kim's life is back to normal without any of the devastating disabilities commonly associated with stroke: paralysis, weakness, memory loss or speech problems. "At first, I started to think about how life would change for us. It was pretty tough. But it's been amazing," says Greg. "Kim doesn't want to be that person people worry about. She's confident things are OK. I am just so thankful to Kim's doctors and nurses at MedStar Montgomery for acting so quickly and giving her the treatments she needed to get better." <<

ACT IMMEDIATELY WHEN YOU SEE STROKE SYMPTOMS

When one or more of these symptoms happens suddenly, suspect stroke, and act fast by calling 9-1-1 to get to the nearest hospital within 60 minutes:

- Numbness or weakness of face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Confusion
- ◆ Trouble seeing from one or both eyes
- Trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- Severe headache with no known cause

Clinical Trial Renews Hope For Cancer Patient

aria C. Garcia of Vienna, Va., knew something was wrong when she started having a lot of pain after eating. But she never expected that would lead to the diagnosis she got in January - the 71-year-old had a tumor in her stomach.

"At the first moment I heard the diagnosis, I wasn't afraid. I just couldn't believe it," Maria says.

She grew fearful, though, when a follow-up MRI showed the cancer had spread all over her stomach and to her liver. The mother of three and grandmother of five says while the physical pain was aggressive enough to wake her up at night, the emotional toll was far worse.

"When they said the word 'cancer' and they said 'Stage 4,' I felt like giving up. I thought there was no point in having treatment. I felt that everything was lost," Maria says tearfully.

A local doctor suggested surgery but wasn't optimistic about the results. So her family sought out a second opinion from Lauretta Odogwu, MD, an oncologist at both MedStar Georgetown University Hospital and MedStar Montgomery Medical Center. Dr. Odogwu and her colleagues are "subspecialists' subspecialists" whose practices are exclusively focused on one type of cancer.

As soon as they started talking, Maria says she began to view her diagnosis differently. "Dr. Odogwu was so caring and so easy to understand. She moved quickly to get me the care I needed. After seeing the effort she was making, I saw it was going to be beneficial for me to go through treatment and chemotherapy. I started to have hope," she says.

The MedStar Georgetown oncologists at MedStar Montgomery Medical Center are dedicated to providing exceptional care to adults with cancer, including breast, lung, genito-urinary, sarcomas and gastrointestinal cancers, in addition to various blood disorders. Clinical trials are also offered at this site. MedStar Montgomery recently expanded its clinical trials program, giving

patients access to any treatment they can get in any large city hospital.

Maria qualified for a molecularly targeted study evaluating drugs for her particular type of tumor. Through this trial, specialized testing of the cancer cells determines whether a particular cancer is likely to respond to a certain drug based on the absence or presence of proteins at the cellular level.

Maria and her family were thrilled when they learned she could take part in the trial at MedStar Montgomery. Having moved in with her daughter in Rockville, she could get to MedStar Montgomery easily.

For Maria and others, the oncologists offer many logistical benefits. She found a vast array of support services, including highly trained oncology-certified nurses and medical assistants, nutritional services, psychosocial distress screening, survivorship support, a nurse navigator and social worker, and even yoga classes.

Maria says she is now full of hope as she begins to tackle her treatment.

"My family and I appreciate all the efforts Dr. Odogwu and her team are making to help us go through this journey. My hope is that the cancer will stop spreading and the tumor shrinks. I hope, with the medication, I will be able to spend more time with my grandchildren, daughters, sons-in-law and my husband of 49 years," Maria says through tears. "It is always good to try. There is hope when you try."
